

FUN FACTS

The word LEGO comes from the two Danish words "leg godt", meaning "play well".

There are over 400 billion LEGO pieces on Earth. If you divide all LEGO pieces by Earth's population, each person would own more than 80 bricks! If stacked together, these elements could form 10 towers reaching all the way to the Moon!

Due to a generous donation of LEGOs from previously used pieces in holiday window displays, GSCWM received 350 boxes with approximately 6,600 LEGO pieces per box! That's enough LEGOs to supply all four of our camps and both of our Leadership Centers!



ABOUT PROGRAMS AND EVENTS

When Pre-Registration is Required

It's very important to register in advance for programs and events, unless the description tells you it's okay to drop in. We're sorry, but we can't accommodate drop-ins when advanced registration is required.

Event Staffing and Supervision

Keeping up with our girls is a big deal! For programs that GSCWM produces and runs, GSCWM staff and registered volunteers are responsible to supervise girls. For events where GSCWM links with a Program Partner who staffs and runs the event, troop leaders and/or parents/guardians are responsible for supervision of their girls. In addition, troops must make sure to meet the required girl: adult ratio. If registering as an individual, and not as a troop, an adult must participate with the girl in the event unless the event description says that's not necessary. For girl-only events, GSCWM staff members are on hand, and we're pros at making sure girls have appropriate supervision so that they can have fun and parents/caregivers can relax!

Who Needs to be a Girl Scout?

GIRLS: Naturally most of our events are for registered Girl Scout members in grades K-12, but you can almost always bring a friend.*

ADULTS: The special safety rules for adults mean that adults must be registered and have a completed CORI check with us if they are:

- Driving girls (other than their own child)
- Counted in the girl: adult ratio
- Actively participating in the event
- Attending an overnight event
- * If responsible for a Girl Scout that is not your child

You don't need to be a registered Girl Scout if you're attending only with your child and not participating in the event, but you're always welcome to join! Add the \$25 adult membership fee to the total due and you're covered for the membership year.

***Bring a Friend:** Friends who aren't current Girl Scouts just need to add the \$35 Girl Scout membership fee to the event fee, and they can join in the fun for one or all Girl Scout events for the membership year!

Permission Slips

Follow these "do's" and you'll be all set! A parent/guardian needs to provide signed, written consent for each girl participating in an activity scheduled to happen any time or any place outside of a regular troop or group meeting. Turning that in to the troop or group leader for events is a must! When your girl is attending on her own without a troop, turn in the permission slip to the event leader during check-in. ABOUT PROGRAMS AND EVENTS

Registration by Program Level

Programs and Events are designed for specific program levels. You will find a notation of those levels to the left of every event name. Program levels relate to school grades as follows:

- D (Daisies): Grades K-1
- B (Brownies): Grades 2-3
- J (Juniors): Grades 4-5
- C (Cadettes): Grades 6-8
- S (Seniors): Grades 9-10
- A (Ambassadors): Grades 11-12

Registration Information

The event description will tell you whether to register through GSCWM or through a Program Partner, and will also provide you with other important information like when and how to register. GSCWM offers the option to register either online or on paper, but if you want to know right away that you've got your spot in a GSCWM program, online registration is the way to go.

Register Online

By registering online, you can see how many spaces are available at the time you register and know immediately if you're placed. Online registration can be done by an individual or by the troop leader through the troop management screen.

- 1. Go to: www.gscwm.org/events.html.
- 2. Locate the event you'd like to attend and click "Register Now." You will be redirected to the online registration system. Follow the prompts to complete the process.
- 3. Payment is due in full at the time of registration. Online registration must be paid with a credit/ debit card.
- 4. You will receive an email confirmation that your registration was received.

Paper Registration

Paper registrations are processed in the order they are received, but may take up to a week to process. Online registrations will take precedence.

- 1. Complete the form on page 30. List all girl and adult participants by the name used on their membership registration.

Cancellation Policy

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For programs that are run by Program Partners, refund policies vary. Check with the partner before registering, if there is a concern.

The following policies relate to GSCWM-run events:

Minimum Attendance

Some things just aren't the same with only a few people attending so we have participation minimums. We hate to disappoint, but if it turns out that too few participants have registered by the date registration closes, we'll need to cancel the event. We'll notify all registered participants, and make sure you get a full refund for events that GSCWM cancels.

Inclement Weather

When bad weather threatens to squash too much of the fun, or we just don't think it's safe, GSCWM may decide that cancelling or re-scheduling the event is best. We'll notify all registered participants, and make sure that you get a full refund for the events that GSCWM cancels. Be sure to check your email and voice mail for messages. If conditions in your area have got you wondering if the event is still on, call 413-584-2602 or 508-365-0115. If it's after hours, we'll post a message on that line.

Cancellation by Participant

Email or write us four weeks before the event to get a refund if you're not going to attend the event you registered for. We'll refund all but a \$5 cancellation fee per person. We're sorry, but we don't offer refunds for not showing up or if you arrive late or leave the event early.

GIRL SCOUT AWARDS

Highest Awards

Bronze. Silver. Gold. These represent the highest honors a Girl Scout can earn.

All three awards give you the chance to do big things while supporting an issue you care about. You might plant a community garden at your school or inspire others to eat healthy foods for your Bronze, advocate for animal rights for your Silver, or build a career network that encourages girls to become scientists and engineers for your Gold. Whatever you choose, you'll inspire others (and yourself).

As you earn one of Girl Scouts' highest awards, you'll change your corner of the world—and beyond. The possibilities are endless!

You can find all Highest Award Guidelines, current GSCWM reports and forms, and many helpful resources at gscwm.org/awards.

Bronze Award Orientations are offered to troop leaders and parents who are interested in arming themselves with the knowledge and tools they'll need to lead their Juniors through a successful Girl Scout Bronze Award experience. **Bronze Award Orientations are required to be taken by at least one adult working with a team of Juniors on their Bronze Awards within one year of beginning the award.**

Bronze Award Workshops are offered to Juniors who are interested in learning the steps to earning their Bronze Award, equipping themselves with some tips and tricks, and even some hands-on activities to get them started on their way. Bronze Award Workshops are not required to be taken by girls but it is a great start to the Bronze journey.

Strive for Silver Orientations are for Cadettes interested in learning about the steps to becoming a Silver Award Girl Scout, the pros and cons of an individual versus a team project, understanding the difference between a Take Action Project and community service, and understanding the importance of the community impact of a project. Troop leaders, advisors, and parents are strongly encouraged to join as well. **Taking a Strive for Silver Orientation is required for all girls within one year of beginning the Silver Award process and submitting a Silver Award Proposal.**

Go for Gold Orientations provide valuable information about the national Gold Award Guidelines, the award process including paperwork, deadlines, what to expect when meeting with the Gold Award Committee (GAC), and an opportunity to get your questions answered from members of the GAC. Leaders, advisors, and parents are also encouraged to attend. **Taking a Go for Gold Orientation is required for all girls within one year of beginning the Gold Award process and submitting a Gold Award Proposal.**

You will find information about all Orientations listed throughout the Program Guide program listings.

Gold Award Committee Meetings are be held over Zoom. Appointments with the GAC can be made by emailing GoldAward@gscwm.org at least one month prior to when you would like an appointment. At a **minimum**, all girls are required to meet with the GAC for their Initial Interviews and Final Reviews. The GAC has scheduled meetings August through June so be sure to plan accordingly and keep in mind they fill up quickly around deadlines.

Bronze, Silver and Gold Patrols: Have questions about the Girl Scout Highest Awards? Whether you are an adult guiding girls through the process or a girl working on award steps, if you want some help brainstorming, need someone to bounce ideas off, or just have a general question about one of the awards itself, join us for these informal chats and Q&A sessions. Patrols take place monthly from August through June on the last business day of the month. While there is no charge to join us, you'll need to register to receive the Zoom link. All Patrol dates and times are listed throughout the program listings. Patrols do NOT take the place of an orientation or meet the orientation requirement but are here to offer you more support throughout the process.

GSUSA Gold Award Scholarship: Did you know that one Gold Award Girl Scout per council receives a national scholarship? To be eligible, you need to have earned your Gold Award and have been approved by the council in the GoGold portal between April 1 and March 31. You'll find that there are other great scholarship opportunities waiting for you as well!

GSCWM owns four camp properties, all of which were developed and maintained for the express purpose of Girl Scout programs in the outdoors that inspire girls to develop a love of nature and a lasting commitment to the environment. Our camps are located throughout central and western Massachusetts and each offers a unique experience.

Service Unit Encampments: Reserve up to nine months prior to your date.

Troop Camping: Reserve up to six months prior to your date.

Campers participating in CIT 2 at Camp Bonnie Brae will go home during the weekend between sessions 2 and 3, then stay on camp for the weekend between sessions 3 and 4.

Summer 2024 is right around the corner and we need your help to hire enthusiastic, talented, and caring individuals to join our Camp Staff team. GSCWM recruits both regionally and internationally, and we carefully select staff based on maturity, program skills, experience, and their ability to serve as role models. Order Cards & Girl Delivery online orders: December 13, 2023 – March 17, 2024 Direct In Person and Booth Sales: January 19 – March 17, 2024

Girl Scouts and their troops begin the planning process for the annual Cookie Program in December. The program kickoff begins on December 13 when participants begin selling using their order cards and online. On January 19, the Direct Sale aspect of the Cookie Program begins in full swing as Girl Scouts start selling with cookies in hand! From virtual booths to drive-thru booth sales and online orders, the 5 Skills are put to work as participants and their troops set goals and determine how to achieve them.

Not in a Troop? Become a Cookie Boss!

As with many fun programs at GSCWM, Girl Scouts do not have to be a member of a troop to participate in the Fall Product and Cookie Programs. Non-troop affiliated girls/Juliette's who are on the non-troop affiliated pathway can participate in the Fall Product Program and during the Cookie Season they can become a Cookie Boss!

Cookie Bosses will sell cookies through the following platforms:

Digital Cookie: Cookie Bosses create customized websites on their own Digital Order Card Platform, for a completely contactless sale.

Order Taking: Using the paper cookie order cards, Cookie Bosses ask neighbors, friends, and family members to place orders for cookies.

Booth Sales/Direct Sales: A Cookie Boss gets cookies and sells them directly to customers, often at booths in high-traffic areas such as grocery stores, malls or at sporting events.

As part of the Cookie Boss program, participants are eligible to earn Cookie Credits if they sell 130 boxes or more. They can use their cookie credits for exciting opportunities like camping and program events sponsored by GSCWM or Service Units, GSCWM Girl Scout Travel, Girl Scout sponsored Destinations, anything sold at GSCWM stores, or any Girl Scout activity. All participants will be able to work on the 5 Skills and help fund their Girl Scout experience while learning valuable life and business skills.

In early December, an email will be sent to all non-troop affiliated girls/Juliette to welcome them to sign up for the Cookie Boss Program. Are you a new non-troop affiliated Girl Scout? If so, email Jessica, jgonzalez@gscwm.org to learn more and become a Cookie Boss!

What do the product programs fund?

The Girl Scout Fall Product and Cookie Programs are two of the few youth-oriented programs in the country providing its participants the ability to decide how to direct the proceeds generated through their business activity. Some participants are using their proceeds for travel, big trips abroad, and local programs. While others use their cookie credits to help fund their way to summer camp or earning their Highest Awards, and many give back to the community by funding their service projects. Council-wide, most of our Girl Scout troops reinvest a portion of their proceeds in service projects that address specific community needs. Many of the troops also take part in Project Care & Share programs which make donations to local food pantries and to our military troops.

All proceeds from the sale of Girl Scout Fall Product and Cookie Programs remain in central and western Massachusetts and benefit Girl Scouts in the community in which the products are sold. The local Girl Scout council uses product program revenue to supply essential services to troops and Girl Scouts, providing program resources and support, training adult volunteers, conducting events, maintaining camps, and providing financial assistance to help make Girl Scouting possible for all that want to participate.

Service to Girl Scouting Bars are earned by volunteering at least 20 hours to the Girl Scout organization, such as at a council-wide event, service unit assistant, or directly on a council special project.

Torch Awards recognize girls who act as leaders in their communities by completing a Girl Scout level Leadership Journey and serving for one full term in a leadership position at school, place of worship, library, community center, or similar organization.

President's Volunteer Service Award – GSCWM is a certifying organization and offers current Girl Scouts and adult members the opportunity to earn this award annually by recognizing volunteers who have achieved the required number of service hours over a 12-month period from September 1 through August 31. Recipients are recognized with a pin, certificate, and letter signed by the President of the United States at an award ceremony held in one of our Leadership Centers. This is the only award girls are allowed to double-dip for-using hours earned on their Bronze, Silver, and Gold Awards, Service Bars, troop volunteering, etc., and applying them to the PVSA.

My Promise, My Faith-Girl Scouts of all grade levels can earn the My Promise, My Faith pin, which helps them make the connection between the Girl Scout Promise and Law to their religion. This pin can be earned each year. Information for each Girl Scout level can be found in The Girl Scout Handbook.

Celebrating Spirituality and Faith-Everything in Girl Scouting is based on the Girl Scout Promise and Law, which includes many of the principles and values common across religions. While we are a secular organization, Girl Scouts has always encouraged girls to take spiritual journeys via their own faiths' religious recognitions. **Teen Mentoring Awards**-When teens guide or teach others, they act as mentors. An exciting part of a Girl Scout's development, teen mentoring is a win-win proposition!

As teen mentors, Girl Scout Cadettes, Seniors, and Ambassadors gain experience by sharing skills, testing knowledge, and trying out new leadership roles. For the younger Girl Scouts being mentored, it means a chance to be with and learn from teens – some of their favorite people!

Teens who earn mentoring awards are given a special opportunity to serve as champions for the Girl Scout Leadership Experience. As they serve in their roles, Cadettes, Seniors, and Ambassadors can help increase awareness of Girl Scouting's aim to deliver fun with purpose: enjoyable and challenging activities that grow Girl Scouts' leadership in their daily lives and in the world.


