Anti-Racism Commitment

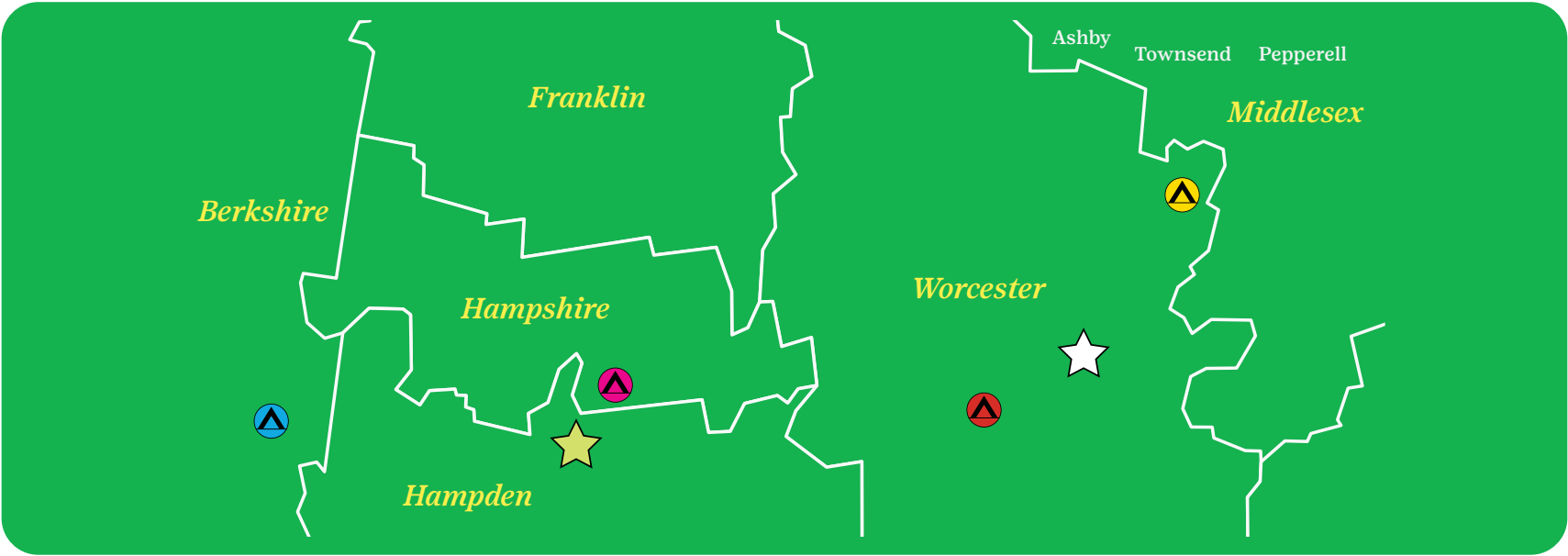

About Programs & Events

When Pre-Registration is Required

It's very important to register in advance for programs and events, unless the description tells you it's okay to drop in. We're sorry, but we can't accommodate drop-ins when advanced registration is required.

Event Staffing and Supervision

Keeping up with our girls is a big deal! For programs that GSCWM produces and runs, GSCWM staff and registered volunteers are responsible for supervising girls. For events where GSCWM collaborates with a Program Partner who staffs and runs the event, troop leaders and/or parents/guardians are responsible for supervision of their girls. In addition, troops must make sure to meet the required girl to adult ratio. If registering as an individual, and not as a troop, an adult must participate with the girl in the event unless the event description says that's not necessary. For girl-only events, GSCWM staff members are on hand, and we're pros at making sure girls have appropriate supervision so they can have fun and parents/caregivers can relax!

Who Needs to be a Girl Scout?

GIRLS: Most of our events are for registered Girl Scout members in grades K-12, but you can almost always bring a friend.*

ADULTS: The special safety rules for adults mean that adults must be registered and have a completed and verified CORI check submitted at least two weeks prior to the event, program, or meeting on file with us if they are:

- Driving girls (other than their own child)
- Counted in the girl to adult ratio
- Actively participating in the event
- Attending an overnight event
- Responsible for a Girl Scout who is not their child

You don't need to be a registered Girl Scout if you're attending only with your child and not participating in the event, but you're always welcome to become a member! Add the \$30 adult membership fee to the total due and you're covered for the membership year.

***Bring a Friend:** Friends who aren't current Girl Scouts just need to add the \$55 Girl Scout membership fee to the event fee, and they can join in the fun for one or all Girl Scout events for the membership year!

Permission Slips

Follow these "do's" and you'll be all set! A parent/guardian needs to provide signed, written consent for each girl participating in an activity scheduled for any time or place outside of a regular troop or group meeting. Turning that in to the troop or group leader for events is a must! When a girl is attending on her own without a troop, turn in the permission slip to the event leader during check-in. Registration & Cancellation

Registration by Program Level

Programs and events are designed for specific program levels. You will find a notation of those levels under each event listing. Program levels relate to school grades as follows:

- Daisies (Grades K-1)
- Brownies (Grades 2-3)
- Juniors (Grades 4-5)
- Cadettes (Grades 6-8)
- Seniors (Grades 9-10)
- Ambassadors (Grades 11-12)

Registration Information

The event description will tell you whether to register through GSCWM or through a Community Program Partner and will also provide you with other important information like when and how to register. GSCWM offers the option to register either online or on paper, but if you want to know right away that you’ve got your spot in a GSCWM program, online registration is the way to go.

Register Online

By registering online, you can see how many spaces are available at the time you register and know immediately if you’re placed. Online registration can be done by an individual or by the troop leader through the troop management screen.

1. Go to: <https://www.gscwm.org/en/discover/activities/event-calendar.html>.
2. Locate the event you’d like to attend and click “Register Now.” You will be redirected to the online registration system. Follow the prompts to complete the process.
3. Payment is due in full at the time of registration. Online registration must be paid with a credit/debit card.
4. You will receive an email confirmation that your registration was received.

Paper Registration

Paper registrations are processed in the order they are received but may take up to a week to process. Online registrations will take precedence.

3. Payment is due in full at the time of registration. Payment can be made via credit card, check, cash, gift card, or cookie credits for in-house programming only.
4. You will receive an email confirmation that your registration was processed.

The following policies relate to GSCWM-run events:

Minimum Attendance

Some things just aren’t the same with only a few people attending, so we have participation minimums. We hate to disappoint, but if it turns out that too few participants have registered by the date registration closes, we’ll need to cancel the event. We’ll notify all registered participants and make sure you get a full refund for events that GSCWM cancels.

Inclement Weather

When bad weather threatens to squash too much of the fun, or we just don’t think it’s safe, GSCWM may decide that canceling or rescheduling the event is best. We’ll notify all registered participants and make sure that you get a full refund for the events that GSCWM cancels. Be sure to check your email and voicemail for messages. If conditions in your area have got you wondering if the event is still on, call 413-584-2602 or 508-365-0115. If it’s after hours, we’ll post a message on those phone lines.

Cancellation by Participant

Email or write to us four weeks before the event to get a refund if you’re not going to attend the event you registered for. We’ll refund all but a \$5 cancellation fee per person. We’re sorry, but we don’t offer refunds for not showing up or if you arrive late or leave the event early.

Community Partner Programs

For programs that are run by Community Partners, refund policies vary. Check with the partner before registering if you would like information about their refund policy.

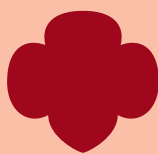

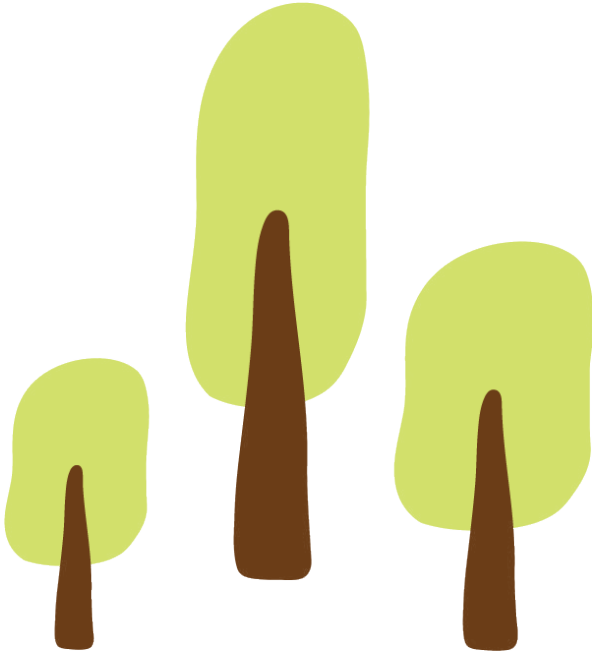

- Activities focus on general election issues and provide age appropriate, non-partisan interpretation of the election process. Girl Scouts will become informed citizens and be the change they want to see in their communities and country, now and in the future.

Election Connection is a nonpolitical and nonpartisan program designed to increase civic participation. As a tax-exempt, § 501(c)(3) organization, Girl Scouts of Central and Western Massachusetts cannot take sides in elections or support or oppose any political candidates. Material will not be used to target a particular political party or individuals on any one side of an issue. The focus is on encouraging everyone, regardless of political party, affiliation, or beliefs, to participate in the democratic process.

Gage Museum

Explore simple machines like never before, easily connecting them, customizing them, and repositioning them on a base—just slide the machines in and out of position! Done with the activity? Try a new design!

Electric Racers

Grades: 4-12 ●●●●

Cost: \$10/girl OR \$30/girl for take-home kit

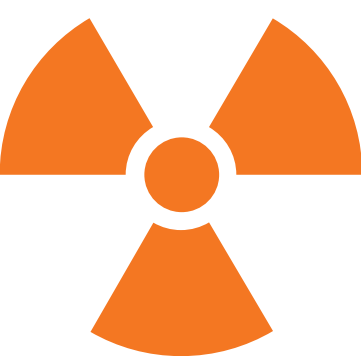
Burn some rubber and engineer a battery powered car. It’s simple and fun to experiment with your design, learning as you try out new race car designs. Take away a wheel, construct a slimmer frame, or build something entirely new with your parts! They are real DIY electronics and real engineering, meaning the making and excitement never end.

Grab Lab

Grades: K-5 ●●●●

Cost: \$5/girl OR \$12/girl for take-home kit

Have you ever seen a bird catch a worm or a chipmunk stuff their cheeks? How do they do it? Animals have evolved some pretty amazing grabbers and tools over time. Construct a simple grabber, then design and build it better to be like our feathered and furry friends.



Hazmat Challenge

Grades: 4-8 ●●

Cost: \$6 per girl (no take-home kit)

There’s been a disaster! Containers holding nuclear waste were damaged in an accident and the radioactive waste must be moved from the damaged containers to new ones. Using whatever parts and materials we have, you’ll need to design a solution! Great team-building activity for your troop.

Hydraulic Claw

Grades: 4-12 ●●●●

Cost: \$6/girl OR \$15/girl for take-home kit

We’ve all lost more than a few quarters to the arcade claw machines. With your Hydraulic Claw, you can forget the coins and create your very own remote-controlled fluid-powered grabber.



Hydraulic Judo-Bots

Grades: 4-12 ●●●●

Cost: \$6/girl or team OR \$20/girl or team for take-home kit*

Get ready to R-R-RUMBLE!! Use the power of hydraulic cylinders to design, build, and battle a Judo-Bot. Engineer new methods to move bots up, down, and side-to-side to best tip or push opponents out of the ring. **One Judo-Bot per girl or per small teams of 2-4.*

Obstacle Course

Grades: K-5 ●●●●

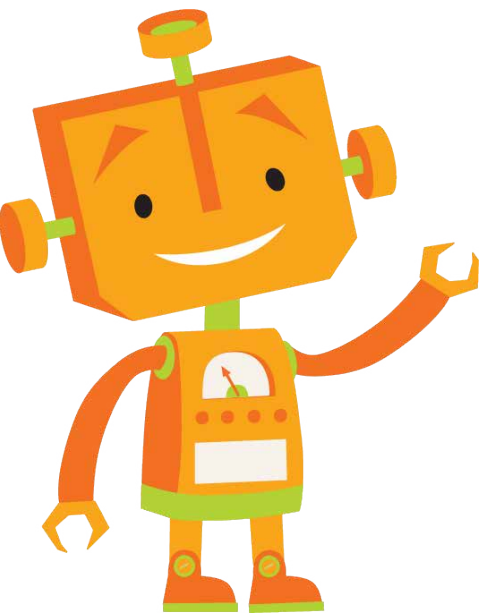

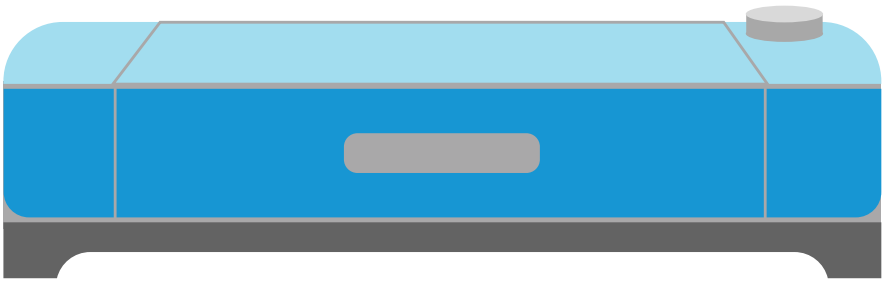

Girl Scout Awards



Highest Awards

Bronze. Silver. Gold. These represent the highest honors a Girl Scout can earn.

All three of the highest awards give you the chance to do big things while supporting an issue you care about. You might plant a community garden at your school or inspire others to eat healthy foods for your Bronze, advocate for animal rights for your Silver, or build a career network that encourages girls to become scientists and engineers for your Gold. Whatever you choose, you will inspire others (and yourself). As you earn one of Girl Scouts' highest awards, you'll change your corner of the world—and beyond.

Bronze Award Orientations are offered to troop leaders and parents who are interested in arming themselves with the knowledge and tools they'll need to lead Juniors through a successful Girl Scout Bronze Award experience. ***Bronze Award Orientations are required to be taken by at least one adult working with a team of Juniors on their Bronze Awards within one year of beginning the award.***

Bronze Award Workshops are offered to Girl Scout Juniors who are interested in learning the steps to earn their Bronze Award, equipping themselves with some tips and tricks, and even some hands-on activities to get them started on their way. Bronze Award Workshops are not required to be taken by girls but is a great start to the Bronze Award journey.



Strive for Silver Orientations are for Girl Scout Cadettes interested in learning about the steps to becoming a Silver Award Girl Scout, the pros and cons of an individual versus a team project, understanding the difference between a Take Action Project and community service, and understanding the importance of the community impact of a project. Troop leaders, advisors, and parents are strongly encouraged to join as well. ***Taking a Strive for Silver Orientation is required by all girls within one year of beginning the Silver Award process and submitting a Silver Award Proposal.***



Go for Gold Orientations provide valuable information about the national Gold Award Guidelines, the award process including paperwork, deadlines, what to expect when meeting with the Gold Award Committee (GAC), and an opportunity to get your questions answered from members of the GAC. Leaders, advisors, and parents are also encouraged to attend. ***Taking a Go for Gold Orientation is required by all girls within one year of beginning the Gold Award process and submitting a Gold Award Proposal.***

Gold Award Committee Meetings are held over Zoom. Appointments with the GAC can be made by emailing GoldAward@gscwm.org at least one month prior to when you would like an appointment, or by submitting your Gold Award Proposal on GoGold. At a *minimum*, all girls are required to meet with the GAC for their Initial Interviews and Final Reviews. The GAC has scheduled meetings August through June, so be sure to plan accordingly and keep in mind they fill up quickly around deadlines.

GSUSA Gold Award Scholarship: Did you know that one Gold Award Girl Scout per council receives a national scholarship? To be eligible, you need to have earned your Gold Award and have been approved by the council in the GoGold portal between April 1 and March 31 of the current year. You'll find that there are other great scholarship opportunities waiting for you as well! Visit girlscouts.org/en/scholarships.html to learn about these great opportunities.



Bronze, Silver, and Gold Patrols: Have questions about the Girl Scout Highest Awards? Whether you are an adult guiding girls through the process, or a girl working on award steps, if you want some help brainstorming, need someone to bounce ideas off of, or just have a general question about one of the awards itself, join us for these informal chats and Q&A sessions. Patrols take place monthly from August through June on the last business day of the month. While there is no charge to join us, you'll need to register to receive the Zoom link. All Patrol dates and times are listed throughout the program listings. ***Patrols do NOT take the place of an orientation or meet the orientation requirement,*** but are here to offer you more support throughout the process.

National Leadership Awards

As Girl Scouts, we take pride in providing service to others and doing what we can to make the world a better place. To recognize older girls (Cadettes through Ambassadors) for their dedication and commitment to both their Girl Scout community and communities at large, girls can be recognized with the following awards:

Community Service Bars are earned when girls make a difference in their community and practice the values of the Girl Scout Promise and Law.

Service to Girl Scouting Bars are earned by volunteering at least 20 hours to the Girl Scout organization, such as at a council-wide event, service unit assistant, or directly on a council special project.

Torch Awards recognize girls who act as leaders in their communities by completing a Girl Scout level Leadership Journey and serving for one full term in a leadership position at school, place of worship, library, community center, or similar organization.

President's Volunteer Service Award

GSCWM is a certifying organization that offers current girl and adult members the opportunity to earn this award annually, by recognizing girl and adult volunteers who have achieved the required number of service hours over a 12 month period, from September 1 through August 31. Recipients are recognized with a pin, certificate, and letter signed by the President of the United States at an award ceremony held in one of our Leadership Centers. Exclusively for this award, girls can apply volunteer service hours earned on their Bronze, Silver, and Gold Award to the total hours for the PVSA.

Religious Awards

My Promise, My Faith

Girls of all grade levels can earn the My Promise, My Faith pin, which helps girls make the connection between the Girl Scout Promise and Law to their religion. This pin can be earned each year. Information for each Girl Scout level can be found in *The Girl Scout Handbook*.

Celebrating Spirituality and Faith

Girl Scouts is founded on the Girl Scout Promise and Law, which includes many of the principles and values common across religions. While we are a secular organization, Girl Scouts has always encouraged girls to take spiritual journeys via their own faiths' religious recognitions. There are national programs and awards for almost every religion that are sponsored by the individual's own faith and based on age.

Teen Mentoring Awards

When girls guide or teach others, they act as mentors. As an exciting part of a Girl Scout's development, teen mentoring is a win-win proposition!

As teen mentors, Girl Scout Cadettes, Seniors, and Ambassadors gain experience by sharing skills, testing knowledge, and trying out new leadership roles. For the girls being mentored, it means a chance to be with and learn from teens—some of their favorite people!

Teens who earn mentoring awards are given a special opportunity to serve as champions for the Girl Scout Leadership Experience. As they serve in their roles, Cadettes, Seniors, and Ambassadors can help increase awareness of Girl Scouting's aim to deliver fun with purpose: enjoyable and challenging activities that grow girls' leadership in their daily lives and in the world.

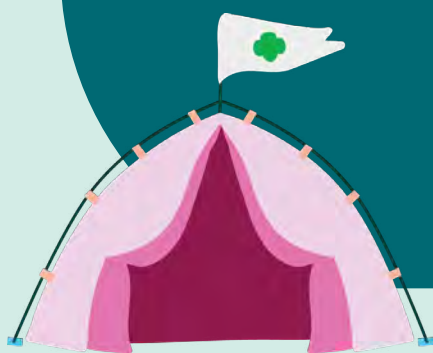

Camp



For more than a century, camping has been a cornerstone of the Girl Scout experience. When girls get outdoors they create lasting memories, develop healthy habits, expand their sense of wonder, and learn new skills. In nature, girls become experiential learners, embrace the unfamiliar, and deepen their relationships to themselves and others. Camping is in our Girl Scout DNA!

GSCWM owns four camps, which share the mission of providing enhanced outdoor Girl Scout programs that inspire a love of nature and a lasting commitment to environmental stewardship. The ongoing development and maintenance of these properties serve the express purpose of creating a comprehensive, modern, and distinctive exposure to the magic of camping. All camps are staffed with well-trained, experienced personnel who act as role models for girls, setting examples for safety, stewardship, and skill building. Camps are located throughout central and western Massachusetts, and each offers a unique experience.



Service Unit Encampments: Reserve up to nine months prior to your date.

Troop Camping: Reserve up to six months prior to your date.

Camp to Troop: Curious about camp, but still not sure if it's for you? This is a great opportunity for girls, volunteers, and parents to get a feel for what it's like to join a long tradition of Girl Scouts going to camp. Play classic camp games, have a camp song singalong, and practice building fires. 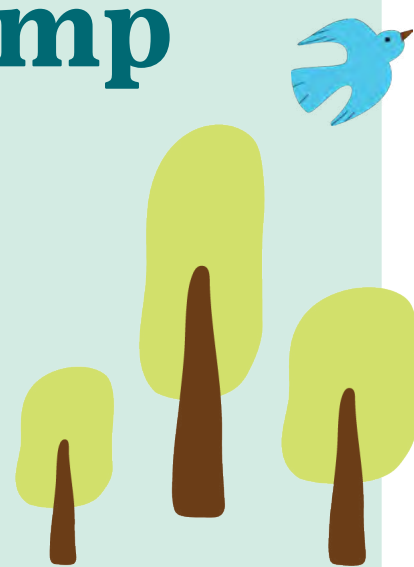

Camp Laurel Wood

Come be a part of day camp at Camp Laurel Wood, located in Spencer. Take a dip in Stiles Reservoir or go out for a spin on a boat. Become a sharp shooter on the archery range and learn new games on the A-Field. Afterward, play in the Gaga Pit and hike to the Wesley Center. 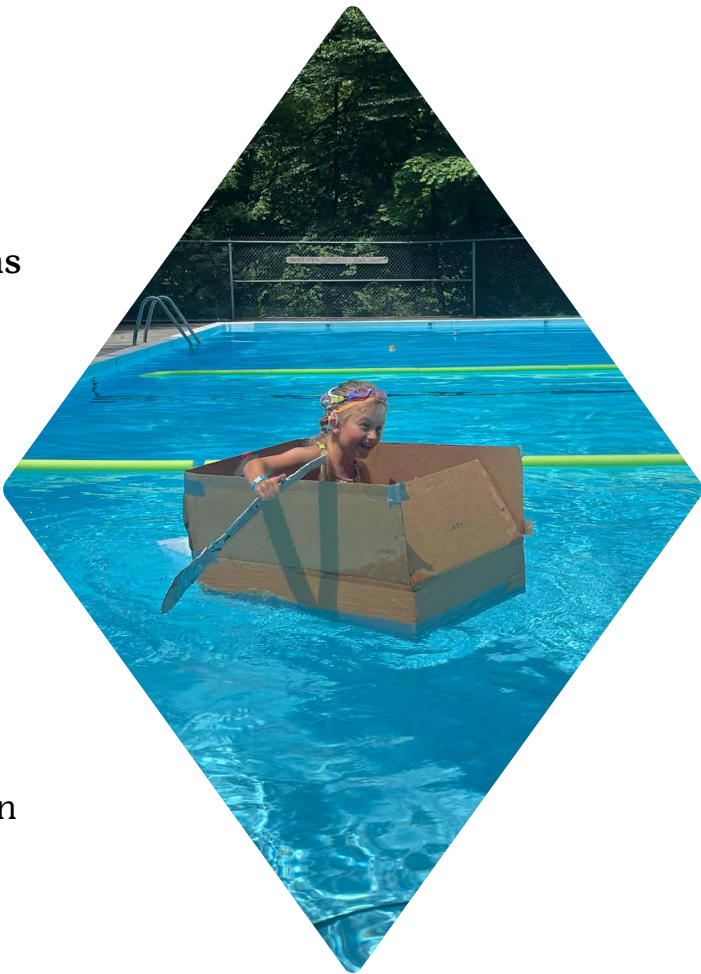

Learn the importance of working as a team and what positions are needed to successfully run a camp program. Shadow camp staff, and learn more about what to expect from campers. This is your opportunity to plan and implement an all-camp activity and spend time in another unit. Campers must go home between sessions. **An application and interview will be required.*

Counselor in Training (CIT) II

Grades 11-12 ●

Camp Bonnie Brae

You'll learn the ins and outs of Camp Bonnie Brae as you dig deeper into leadership practices, and the steps necessary to create a safe community for campers. Develop and teach a specialty. Put it all into action when you spend a week working side-by-side with camp staff. Campers must go home in between sessions. **An application and interview will be required. Must have completed CIT I.*

Camp Intern

Grade 12 ●

Camp Bonnie Brae

Girls entering grade 12 can now join us for a Camp Internship. Camp Interns build their leadership, communication and problem solving skills, to

help them prepare for a future working on camp staff. The majority of the week is spent working in units or program areas. Camp Interns are still considered campers and will go home between sessions. **Limited number of spots available to those who have completed both CIT I and CIT II. An application and interview will be required.*
